implement services to promote the family's capacity to care for their child and promote growth and development in natural environments where families live, work and play. Successfully complete other duties as assigned.



- Approaches community relationships across the region with cultural humility, deep listening skills, and flexibility

WORK ENVIRONMENT

The ideal candidate would be joining our fantastic team of early childhood professionals. Sprout offers a comprehensive benefits package. The physical demands and work environment described here are representative of those that must be met by an employee to successfully perform the essential functions of this job. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions. While performing the duties of this job, the employee often needs to sit and talk or hear, communicate and write clearly and type. The employee is frequently required to stand; walk; and reach with hands and arms. The employee must often lift and/

or move up to 10 pounds and occasionally lift and/or move up to up to 50 pounds of testing equipment, toys and supplies. Must be able to sit on the floor and move quickly after infants and toddlers. Specific vision abilities required by this job include close vision and ability to adjust focus. The noise during group sessions and special events is often loud. The usual noise and vibration level in the work environment is moderate, as would be expected in an office setting. However, in the process of conducting home visits, the employee may be exposed to many different home environments with various levels of accessibility, and/or rapidly changing driving conditions.

SCHEDULE

Sprout's hours of operation are Monday through Friday, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. However, Sprout values flexible schedules to meet the needs of both staff and clients. Work on

some nights and weekends may be required. This position may require day and overnight travel to rural Alaskan communities by small plane, boat, or other vehicle.
